Key competencies for learning and life	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Ensure the development of competencies for learning and life and a sense of hope and agency in every learner 4. Encourage independence of mind and action and the development of individual interests and talents 5. Excite the imagination, encourage curiosity and develop creativity
The world's major branches of learning	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 6. Secure learners' knowledge, skills and understanding of the world's major branches of learning and subjects 7. Ensure understanding of how learning in different disciplines is interconnected and relevant to life, global issues and world events past, present and future 8. Provide clear and relevant pathways for learning and the flexibility to respond to developing needs, interests and contexts
